WCCC offers an Associate in Applied Science in Criminal Justice. The Associate in Applied Science is a two-year program that prepares you to enter into a variety of law enforcement and law enforcement support careers. Police officers, federal law enforcement/ homeland security, and Detectives are in high demand in a growing career. Probation and Corrections Officers are also in high demand. Program Education Outcomes:

Upon completion of the Associate in Applied Science Degree in the Criminal Justice Program, the graduate is prepared to:

2. Apply critical thinking and problem solving techniques to the criminal justice and computer forensics environment.

6. Be a responsible member of society and the workforce, applying knowledge skills and abilities, ultimately, for the betterment of one's local community.
