WCCC offers an Associate in Applied Science in Education.

The Education program at Washington County Community College has a twofold purpose: First, the program is specifically designed to enhance the skills and abilities of educational Para-professionals currently working in schools throughout Maine. Students completing the Associate in Science Degree in Education at WCCC will be qualified for a variety of para-professional positions in Maine schools; second, the program provides an intensive introduction to the field of Education for those who are considering teaching as a future career.

With many teachers in Maine nearing retirement and with the continued growth of school populations, employment opportunities in all areas of Education are growing. The Maine Department of Labor lists "Teacher Assistants" as one of the "bright outlook" employment fields in Maine between the years 2010 and 2020.

The Education program focuses on providing students with an excellent background in a variety of educational skills and knowledge. In addition to an in-depth study of foundational skills, the program also focuses on enhancing student knowledge and abilities in curriculum development, managing student behavior, working with diverse populations, and in the effective use of educational technology. A strong background in Special Education is also provided.
